Agenda 39.1 Welcoming the Members

Seeking the blessings of His Holiness Jagadguru Dr. Sri Shivarathri Rajendra Mahaswamiji, Founder President of JSS Mahavidyapeetha and His Holiness Jagadguru Sri Shivarathri Deshikendra Mahaswamiji, present President of JSS Mahavidyapeetha, Dr. S Prathibha, Principal welcomed all the members to the meeting and also thanked the outgoing members of the previous Governing Body for their valuable contributions and support in all endeavours. The Principal took up the agenda for discussion.

Agenda 39.2 Reading and Recording of the Proceedings of the 38th Governing Body Meeting held on 08 March 2023

The Principal informed that the Proceedings of 38th Governing Body Meeting held on 08 March 2023 were communicated to all the members and no comments were received. Further, she requested the members to approve the Proceedings. The Proceedings of the previous Governing Body meeting were read and recorded.

Agenda 39.3 Action Taken Report on the Proceedings of the 38th Governing Body

meeting held on 08 March 2023

Agenda 39.3 (38.4) Approval of UG and PG Admissions 2022-23

Prof. Lakshmana Ayyappa Kulagodu and Dr. S Srikantaswamy suggested taking

appropriate measures to improve the admissions to UG Science Programmes, M.Com and MSW

Programmes.

Action Taken

The admissions for first year B.Sc and BCA were 181 and 187 for the year 2022-23

respectively. The admissions for first-year B.Sc and BCA is 204 and 275 for the year 2023-24

respectively. There is an increase in admissions by 13% for first year B.Sc and 47% for BCA.

The action taken regarding admissions to the M.Com and MSW will be presented in the next

Governing Body meeting.

Decision: Approved

Agenda 39.3 (38.5) Approval of VI Semester UG and IV Semester PG Examination

results for the year 2021-22

Prof. R Mugeshappa suggested taking appropriate measures to improve the results in IV

semester UG Examinations.

Action Taken

The results of BA, BBA and B.Voc (SD) were 41.18%, 54.10% and 29.41% respectively

for the fourth semester of 2021-22. In the same batch of students in their fifth semester, the

results of BA, BBA and B.Voc (SD) are 92%, 66% and 75% respectively in 2022-23. The

improvement in results is significant.

Agenda 39.3 (38.6.d) Approval of modifications/amendments to evaluation and

finalization of results of PG Programmes

Dr. S Srikantaswamy suggested opting for the single evaluation of theory papers of PG

examinations instead of a double evaluation. The suggestion is noted.

Action Taken

The proposed change for single valuation of PG semester-end theory answer scripts was

put forward before the PG HODs meeting on 07 September 2023 at 4:30 p.m. The majority of

the PG HODs opined to retain the double valuation system.

Decision: Approved

Agenda 39.3 (38.8.b) Competitive Examination Training Cell

Prof. R Mugeshappa suggested encouraging more students to write competitive

examinations.

Action Taken

The number of students who have appeared for competitive examinations as per the data

provided in the 38th GB Meeting was 595. Presently, from 09 March 2023, a total of 145

students have appeared for competitive examinations. The notification for recruitment in

various sectors is happening slowly because of the change of Government and hence only 145

students could appear for competitive examinations.

Agenda 39.3 (38.8.d) Progress Report-Activities and Achievements of Students

Prof. R Mugeshappa suggested the improvement of placement.

Action Taken

The number of students shortlisted for placement was 60 as per the data provided in the

38th GB Meeting. Presently from 09 March 2023 a total of 334 students have been shortlisted

for placements.

Agenda 39.3 (38.8.e) Progress Report- Academic Activities of Teachers

Dr. S Srikantaswamy suggested more number of College Faculty registering for Ph.D.

programmes. Prof. R Mugeshappa and Dr. S Srikantaswamy suggested that faculty members

should publish more research papers in reputed journals and also present research articles at

conferences.

Action Taken

The teaching faculties have been informed to publish their research in SCOPUS/WoS/SCI

Journals.

Decision: Approved

Agenda 39.4 Approval of UG admissions for the year 2023-24 as of 31 August 2023

Dr. S Prathibha presented the total number of students admitted to various UG

Programmes for the year 2023-24.

Discussion:

Prof. Mugeshappa enquired about the total intake for UG Programmes.

Prof. BV Sambashivaiah said that the total intake is 1181 for UG Programmes for the year 2023-

24, including the additional intake.

Dr. G Hemantha Kumar appreciated the College for its efforts to make good admissions.

enquired whether the admissions for B.Voc Programmes

Prof. BV Sambashivaiah said that the admissions for B.Voc Programmes are good and

especially for B.Voc Animation the total number of students admitted this year is 44

Decision: Approved

Agenda 39.5 Approval of UG and PG odd-semester examination results

Dr. S Prathibha presented the UG and PG odd-semester examination results.

Discussion:

Dr. G Hemantha Kumar enquired about the low percentage of results in the BA First

Semester Programme. Prof. BV Sambashivaiah said that the reason is attributed to the course

English. Further, he said that there is improvement in results in the subsequent semesters.

Sri B Niranjana Murthy also opined the same.

Agenda 39.6 (a) Approval of structure and syllabi for Undergraduate Degree

Programmes for the year 2023-24

Dr. S Prathibha requested the approval of the structure and syllabi for UG Degree

Programmes for the year 2023-24.

Discussion:

Dr. G Hemantha Kumar suggested using the terminology Honors for a four year UG

Degree. Prof. BV Sambashivaiah said that the nomenclature is as per the State Government's

Directions. Sri B Niranjana Murthy further said that there is minimal scope for colleges to make

any changes to the curriculum and nomenclature as per State Government Guidelines.

Agenda 39.6 (b) Approval to opt for single valuation of semester-end theory answer

scripts for Postgraduate Degree Programmes

Dr. S Prathibha requested all the members for suggesting to opt for single valuation or to

retain the double valuation system of semester-end theory answer scripts for PG Degree

Programmes.

Discussion:

Dr. G Hemantha Kumar suggested retaining the double valuation system semester-end

theory answer scripts for PG Degree Programmes. All the other members endorsed the

suggestion.

Dr. S Prathibha requested all the members to accord permission for the college to seek an

additional intake of 60 for the MCA Programme for the year 2023-24.

Agenda 39.10 Progress Report

Dr. S Prathibha presented in detail the progress made by the college since the last meeting

in organizing seminars/ conferences/ workshops, NSS & NCC activities, placements,

competitive examination training, student participation in co-curricular activities, research

publications, presentations of research work in conferences by the faculty, PhD guidance, PhD

awardees, extramural research funding and library stock.

Discussion:

Dr. G Hemantha Kumar appreciated the college for the overall progress made and

suggested improvement in research components. He also suggested that the faculty members

should publish research papers in highly reputed journals so that their h-index will be improved.

Prof. Mugeshappa suggested that all the faculty members need to publish and present research

papers at conferences and publish book chapters more in number since it is essential for the

faculty's academic promotions. He further suggested that the faculty members present papers

and not just participate in conferences and or seminars.

Smt. Savitha Mallappa enquired whether any feedback was obtained regarding the

interaction made by the resource persons from the industries with students and whether was it

helpful. Prof. BV Sambashivaiah said that the placement data of the college was around 50-70

before such industry-institute interactions and presently it has reached about 400. Smt. Savitha Mallappa appreciated the same. Further, she enquired about the availability of e-content of the books and journals in the library, Prof. BV Sambashivaiah said there is access to the e-content through N-LIST and various other web sources for the readers. Dr. S Prathibha also opined the same.
